Ancient historical topics **are generally presented** using sources from the translations of ancient authors, all of which are documented, mainly following the references to **the Thracian/Geto/Dacian** who, personally, believe that they were all part of **the great nation of the Thracians, and who, there are signs, would have spoken the same language**. There is a very large volume of information in the specialized literature, which even if it is cataloged, perhaps arbitrarily unreliable, unclear, and insufficient, many lead in the same direction and even complement each other, being difficult to ignore. In the presented albums, **there are mainly unclear, controversial topics, interpreted differently by experts** (historians, archaeologists, etc.) from other countries. Last but not least, **there are also exposed, new, perhaps novel opinions, interpreting facts and connections between different credible sources, corroborated with the symbolism of some ancient coins, opinions that are strictly personal. One reason why I started putting something on paper is also because I felt like I had something to say! In addition, nowadays, in schools, history seems to be no longer a priority, even more so ancient history, considered too distant in time. Unfortunately...!**
